Overview

What facilities does Lomé have?

Key facilities include the Lomé Container Terminal (LCT), equipped with nine ship-to-shore gantry cranes and 24 terminal cranes, and a 50-hectare storage area. The port also offers a third dock (450 meters, 15 meters deep), modern stevedoring services, and is expanding with dry port and industrial zone developments.

How big is the port of Lomé?

The Port of Lomé is West Africa's leading deep-water port, featuring a 16.6-meter draft and a 1,050-meter straight dock at its main container terminal, enabling it to handle the largest container vessels, including those up to 24,000 TEU after recent dredging.

What is Lomé known for?

Lomé, Togo: A vibrant port city blending colonial history with African culture. Lomé, the capital of Togo, is located on the Gulf of Guinea in West Africa and serves as the country's principal seaport. Covering over 900 hectares, it is the largest port in West Africa and ranks 93rd globally in container throughput.
